We also have an active Eco Council which meets once a month to talk about Eco issues in the school and share ideas for how the school could be even more Ecofriendly! They also carry out important Eco jobs every week, such as emptying the class recycling bins, filling up the bird feeders, watering our herb & vegetable gardens, topping up the pond and bird baths, litter picking, reading the electricity and gas meters, and carrying out spot checks on classrooms to see how Eco-friendly they are.

We have an Eco display board in the hall and all the classrooms have an Eco display board too! CHECK THEM OUT!

We choose a different Eco focus each term and plan activities around that focus. We always have lots of fun!

We have an Action Team of the Ambassadors, Mr Bowen, Mrs Turner, Mrs Sykes, Mrs Davidson, Mr Meek and Mr Cullens. Every year we undertake an environmental review and decide which aspects we can improve to make our Action Plan.

All the things we have done so far mean that we achieved the Eco Schools Green Flag Award in July 2012. After another in-depth assessment, this was reaccredited to us in July 2014. This is a brilliant achievement – well done Maple School!
