Free Writing:


30 minute independent writing activity each week.

Reading in School

Guided Reading (30 minutes every day (3 times a week)

Thursday = Individual reading with an adult
Monday, Tuesday & Thursday = Whole Class Guided Reading

- Please read this book at school/home.
- Homework task set each week.
- Your child will know which day they read on!


Individual independent reading in class (daily) -can be school books or their own.



Reading at Home

Reading at home - to an adult and on their own is still important.

Books will be handed out this Friday.



Reading Rewards!



Should read three times a week – actively.

This should include commenting in their reading diary about the target I have given them.

Awards if achieved!

Maths

- Early Morning Maths each morning
- Maths recall starters

(recapping from last year, last term and last week)

- Reasoning focus (so children can explain why)
- Problem solving questions (deepening understanding)
- Miss Goymer will be teaching the majority of the Maths curriculum throughout the year, whilst Mrs Theivam will be teaching the Shape, Space and Measure areas of the Maths curriculum on a Wednesday.

PE

Our PE lessons will be on **Tuesday afternoon and Friday morning** where PE kits will be needed.

Girls and boys will change separately in Year 5 for privacy reasons.

Activities covered this term are:

Gymnastics, Netball, Dance and Tag Rugby.



Please ensure that your child has <u>named</u> indoor and outdoor kits available each week and suitable outdoor trainers.

<u>Warmer clothes</u> will be needed for the colder months. (Dark jogging bottoms – Maple jumpers/fleeces.)

Classroom Organisation

- Maths and English groups are mixed ability but flexible day to day support is provided depending on confidence in a specific subject.
- Children sometimes work individually/in pairs/small groups/as a whole class.
- Targets are set on a short term basis linking with teachers' marking.
- Ongoing teacher assessments/end of unit/half termly/end of year assessments.
- Groupings may change over the year based upon the nature of activities and based upon progress.
- Some activities will be ability based on the child's own assessment of their learning.
- Tables spaces will be changed every half term.



Year 5 expectations

- We have <u>HIGH expectations</u> of <u>all</u> the children, they are in the Upper KS2 now!
- Children are expected to work as hard as they can to reach their targets.
- High levels of writing in <u>all subjects</u>, not just English.
- We aim to support the children in developing their independence.
- All children are encouraged to be <u>supportive and</u> caring members of the class.

- High expectations in Year 5 for behaviour.

School Uniform - Policy

- Red polo shirt (school logo preferred)
- Grey pinafore, skirt or culottes
- Grey school shorts or trousers (no leggings)
- Green school sweatshirt/jumper or cardigan (school logo preferred)
- Plain, black school shoes or black trainers (no open toed sandals, sliders, ballet pumps, crocs or fashion footwear)
- > Grey, red or green tights
- Grey, or white socks
- Red or green gingham summer dress (Optional)
- No long or short sleeved tee shirts to be worn under Maple red tee-shirts

<u>School Uniform – PE Kit</u>

- Green shorts
- Red t-shirt (school logo preferred)
- Some pupils may still be wearing the old white t-shirt and red shorts until they outgrow them
- Trainers for outdoor PE
- Tracksuits/ warm clothing must be worn for cold weather (red school hoodie and green jogging bottoms can be worn)
- Hair should be kept clean and tidy and should not be worn in any extreme style. Long hair should be fastened or tied back neatly with simple small hair fastenings in school colours (fashion accessories are not permitted). Hair should not be shaved below a grade 2 (No patterns or tramlines should be shaved into the hair).


Home Study

Maths Home Study


MyMaths
